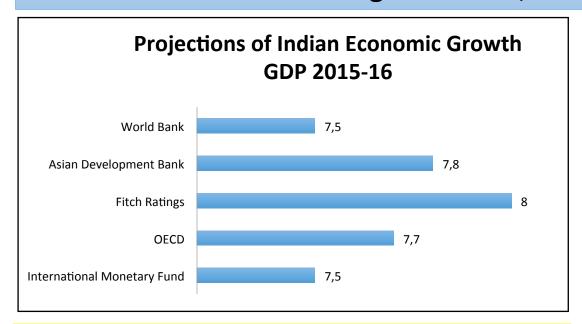

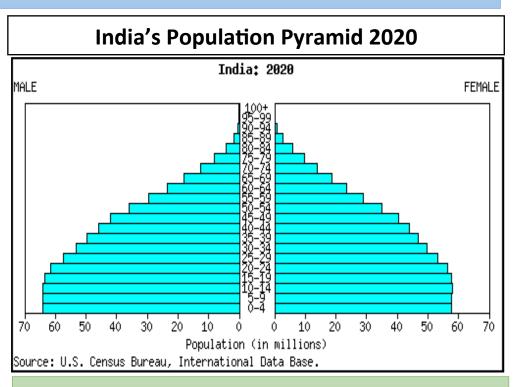
INDIA'S ECONOMIC GROWTH PROSPECTS



India is back on the global business map: Growth in trade & investment, high level visits & business delegations and, economic reforms



- Surpassing China's GDP growth rate which is projected to grow by 7% in 2015 & 6.8% in 2016
- Economic growth is expected to remain strong & stable driven by buoyant domestic consumption & investment
- Government committed to reforms FDI, Goods & Services Tax, Land acquisition laws, etc.



- One of India's competitive advantages is its demographic dividend.
- Poised to become the world's youngest nation by 2020 with an average age of 29 years.



EASE OF DOING BUSINESS





- India is currently at 142nd position out of 189 countries ranked by the World Bank for ease of doing business
- Business development is hampered by a deficient infrastructure, red tape, lack of clarity on regulation and taxation issues
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi aims to improve India's position to the top 50 in the World Bank rankings on the ease of doing business from the current 142 by 2017.
- To improve ease of doing business, government has taken measures to streamlined Customs clearance (fewer forms & single window clearance), simplified employment rules and introduced self-certification for labour safety measures, easier property registration, faster electricity, water and sewage connections, eBiz portal to facilitate registration of companies, e-visas, etc.
- 90% of the Swedish companies in India perceived a favorable investment climate (compared to 51% in 2013) in the coming three years (Swedish Chamber of Commerce in India Business Climate Survey 2014)



Policy Priorities of the Narendra Modi Government



- Make in India: The aim of this initiative is to increase the share of manufacturing in the country's GDP from 16% currently to 25% by 2022 and to create 100 million jobs
- Smart Cities Mission: Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 100 smart cities project aimed at recasting the urban landscape of the country by making cities more livable and inclusive besides driving economic growth.
- Digital India Mission: It aims at providing digital infrastructure as a utility to every citizen as well as high-speed Internet as a core utility in all village councils.







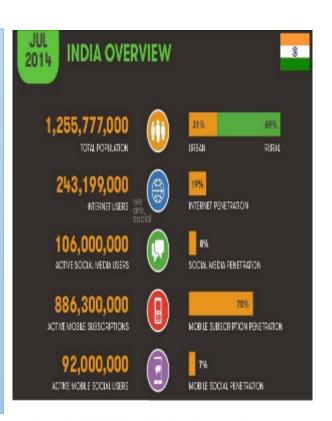


HIGH GROWTH SECTORS OF RELEVANCE
